GATEWAY LAB SCHOOL – A NEW CHARTER SCHOOL DESIGNED FOR CHILDREN EXPERIENCING ACADEMIC DIFFICULTY IN TRADITIONAL SCHOOL SETTINGS HAS BEEN APPROVED BY THE DELAWARE BOARD OF EDUCATION

Newark, DE – June 9, 2010 - In May, the Delaware Board of Education unanimously approved the charter application for Gateway Lab School (GLS). GLS will open in Newark, DE in the fall of 2011 with students in grades 3-7, eventually serving students in grades 1-8.

The Board of Gateway Lab School consists of concerned community members looking to improve educational opportunities for children using a program that combines integrated arts, multi-sensory, and experiential instruction, that seeks to identify and capitalize on a student's strengths and interests while utilizing effective research-based techniques to help each student learn. Research has shown that students who struggle academically in the traditional school environment benefit greatly from this model. They have found a viable solution: The Lab School of Washington®. This private school, located in Washington D.C., utilizes the Academic Club MethodTM, a unique teaching technique developed specifically for students with learning disabilities and ADHD. The program emphasizes the arts and hands-on experiential learning to help these students become active learners, and has been extremely successful, with over 90% of children with learning disabilities graduating from the program and enrolling in college.
